#### A LITTLE HISTORY FOR YOU:

Camp Northward started with 33 students in August of **1941** on the family farm of Raymond and Bell Odor. That first year there were no buildings or physical accommodations available – just an outdoor privy!

In May of **1952** it was announced that a generous gift of 7.53 acres in Falmouth, KY had been given to Northward by Miss Jessie Oldham. Miss Oldham is quoted as saying, "...in giving this land to Camp Northward I am fulfilling a dream of having a place to train young people in the Word of God."

After the devastating flood of **1997**, land was purchased on Broadford Road with the plan to move Camp Northward out of the flood zone.

In **2019** we completed the transition to Broadford Road. We look forward to many years of Christian ministry on this new campus. Thank you to everyone who made this transition possible!

## Camper Policies



**Authorized Pick Up |** individuals must be on the predetermined authorized pick-up list and have a valid picture identification ready in order to pick up a camper.

**Canteen Time** | Camp Northward is an all-inclusive camp experience. Campers will not need any money during their week of camp. All meals, snacks, canteen and activities are included in the cost of registration. During check-in/check-out, money can be given to support our mission for the summer. That is also a good time to purchase camp merch.

**Cell Phones** | Camp Northward is a cell phone-free zone for campers. Faculty and staff will use cell phones sparingly. Camper cell phones may be left at home or left in the camp office for safekeeping until the end of their session. Campers who leave a cell phone in the office are responsible for recovering it in a timely manner (the office will not drive, mail, etc. a cell phone to a camper's home).

**Check-in + Check-Out |** Please remember: arrive at the Pavilion early. Campers must be checked in by a parent or guardian unless "self-transport" was indicated on their registration form. To ensure the safety of our guests, no personal vehicles may go beyond the Pavilion parking lot during check-in. Transportation will be provided for Treehouse Adventure campers.

Mail | Parents can leave letters at the camp office, ideally at check-in time. Campers may also receive physical mail to our mailing address: Camp Northward | P.O. Box 128 | Falmouth, KY 41040. (Please note that we will not forward mail received after the session is over.) We do not use email at this time.

**Registration & Costs** | Registration for each camp session will be closed **two business days** prior to the start of the session. (This is typically the Thursday before.) Camper tuition (family portion) must also be paid at least **two business days** prior to the start of the session.

**Treehouse Adventure Mail** | TA campers will have one mail time per session. It will be on the Wednesday of their session.



## Camper Rules



- Respect others' bodies, emotions and belongings.
  - "So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 7:12)
- Modest and decent clothing must be worn at all times. Failure to abide by the dress code will be considered grounds for being sent home. Please see the camp "Dress Code" and guidelines below for further information.
- Once you are here, don't leave! Permission to leave the grounds may only be obtained from the Dean & the Director. The camper must also be signed out by the parent/guardian or otherwise authorized adult.
- All illnesses must be reported to the Nurse immediately. Please don't come to camp if you are sick. If you are running a temperature in the 24 hour period prior to the session, please stay home. Campers may arrive after they are temperature-free for 24 hours and they are feeling better.
- The use of tobacco, alcohol, narcotics, undesirable language, weapons and firearms are forbidden on camp property.
- Be respectful of camp property. Campers who destroy camp property (buildings, walls etc.) will be responsible for the cost of repair. Please do not write on the bunks, walls, etc.



## **Clothing Guidelines**

Please keep in mind that the environment of Camp Northward is purposefully different than school, work or even home. This goal is reflected, in part, by our clothing guidelines. The purpose of clothing at Camp Northward is to protect and cover. We do not want clothing to flaunt or draw attention to our bodies, nor promote anything that would go against the Word of God. Clothing promoting alcohol or tobacco products, as well as those that have suggestive statements, grotesque scenes or other graphics that are not consistent with a Christian environment may not be worn or displayed.

Remember that the ultimate goal is to bring glory to God, no matter what.
